<b>PURPOSE</b>	<b>NEW REQUIREMENTS</b>	<b>ENTRY NO:</b>	
Tests confirm that the horse has achieved the impulsion, engagement, uphill balance and self-carriage required in Level 3. Level 4 movements should be performed with greater engagement, straightness, suppleness and balance. The marked lightness of the forehand results from a distinct lowering of the haunches and thoroughness required in the partial lope pirouette. A solid foundation is evidenced throughout by a correct, willing, harmonious, performance softly on the aids. 9	V - R R	Extended walk Collected walk	Suppleness of the back; reach to the contact with balance, freedom, and optimum ground cover; clear transitions.		2		
10	M C G - B	Collected lope Turn left down centerline Half pass left	Smooth transition; engagement; self-carriage; alignment maintaining self-carriage and tempo; soft, willing bend; reach and crossing of legs; fluency.		2		
11	Between P & F	Flying change of lead	Straightness; fluency of the change; correct footfalls; ground cover; consistent tempo before and after change.				
12	K - S S	Lengthen stride in lope Collected lope	Clear transitions; moderate lengthening of stride and frame with same tempo as collected lope.				
13	C G - E	Turn down centerline Half pass right	Engagement; self-carriage; alignment maintaining self-carriage and tempo; soft, willing bend; reach and crossing of legs; fluency.		2		
14	Between V & K	Flying change of lead	Straightness; fluency of the change; correct footfalls; ground cover; consistent tempo before and after change.				
15	F - R R	Lengthen stride in lope Collected lope	Clear transitions; moderate lengthening of stride and frame with same tempo as collected lope.				
16	E I	Half circle left 10m Halt, salute	Engagement; self-carriage; straightness; balance in transition to square, straight halt; immobility.				

Leave arena at A in a walk with looped or long reins.

GAITS: freedom and regularity; elasticity of the steps.		1		
IMPULSION: engagement - transmission of an eager and energetic, yet controlled positive forward energy generated from the hindquarters into the athletic movement of the horse; suppleness of the back.		2		
RIDER'S POSITION, SEAT AND HANDS: well-balanced elastic seat demonstrating vertical, centered alignment, with light independent contact from hand(s).		1		
RIDER'S CORRECT AND EFFECTIVE USE OF THE AIDS: evidenced by the horse's responsiveness; steady elastic connection cultivating athletic expression. Accuracy - precise placement of the figures and transitions, the effectiveness of the rider's aids determines the accurate fulfillment of the required movements of the tests.		1		
HARMONY: The horse accepts the aids and influence of the rider with attention, relaxation and confidence; and demonstrates a willing partnership between horse and rider resulting in a free flowing performance.		2
